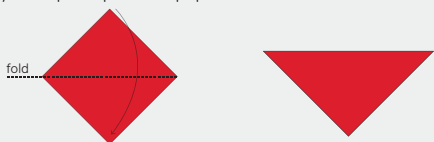




HOPE FOR JUSTICE

It is a swallow, which returns to its nesting place – just as we want to help survivors return to their families. You can use these instructions to make your own origami bird! 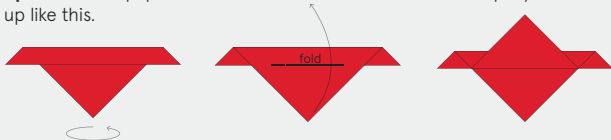
Step 1: Fold your square piece of paper in half to create half of a triangle



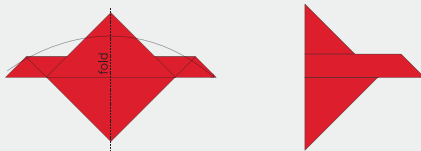
Step 2: Fold part of the top down so that the edge is about halfway down.



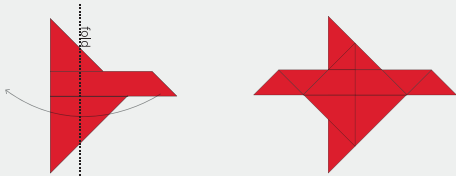
Step 3: Turn the paper over. Take the bottom corner of the top layer and fold it up like this.



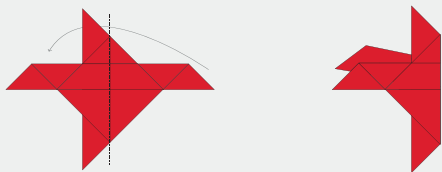
Step 4: Fold the figure in half by folding the left side over to the right.



Step 5: Now fold that same flap back like so to make one of the wings, and do the same with the other wing to end up with something like this.



Step 6: Do the same with the other wing to end up with something like this.



Step 7: Push the centre of the head in and flatten. This is called an inside reverse fold. And voila! You have created an origami bird.

Now it's time to set it free!
